1. So

Present Simple

- I like strawberry ice-cream.
- So **do** I!

- She has two brothers.
- So **does** he!

Present Continuous

- I **am** watching a football game on TV now.
- So **am** I.

- We **are** going to Spain this month.
- So **are** we!

Past Simple

- I went to a great concert last weekend.
- So **did** I!

Present Prefect

- We **have** just moved in.
- So **have** they.

- She **has** already finished.
- So **has** he.

Past Continuous

- I **was** thinking about Anne.
- So **was** I.

- We **were** sightseeing all day.
- So **were** we!

Future Simple

- I **will** go there tomorrow.
- So **will** they.

2. Neither (nor)

Present Simple

- I **don't** like fish.
- Neither **do** I.

- She **doesn't** have children.
- Neither **does** he.

Present Continuous

- We **are** not going home yet.
- Neither **are** we!

Past Simple

- I **didn't** watch news last night.
- Neither **did** I!

Present Perfect

- We **have** never been to Athens.
- Neither **have** we.

- I **haven't** seen this film yet.
- Neither **have** I.

Past Continuous

- I **wasn't** talking about him.
- Neither **was** I.

Future Simple

- I **will** not give up.
- Neither **will** she.
